

Information in accordance with Article 13 and Article 14 GDPR¹

Privacy notice on the processing of personal data from customers, suppliers and service providers

Personal data relating to customers, suppliers and service providers is processed, or may be processed, by ECOMAL Europe GmbH (hereinafter: ECOMAL). Personal data is any data that can be linked to a natural person, e.g. name and e-mail address.

By way of this document, we aim to fulfil our information obligations under Article 13 and Article 14 GDPR.

3. Purpose and legal basis of data processing

We process, or may process, your personal data largely for the following purposes:

Processing activity	Processing purpose
Master data	Data made available by you (your name, e-mail address and telephone number) so that we have a designated contact person at our customers', manufacturers' and service providers' organisations whom we can contact if necessary. Whether dealing with contractual matters (e.g. queries regarding invoicing or the handling of complaints) or for other purposes, such as, for example, clarifying technical issues, sending component samples or inviting you to trade fairs.
List of visitors	For visitors to our Kirchzarten site, we collect anonymised data about their name, company and the time of their visit to ensure they enjoy a safe and trouble-free visit. For example, with regard to evacuation in the event of a fire.
Sanctions list check	Check whether or not the customer, supplier or service provider is entered in a sanctions list

Dispatch of goods	When dispatching goods to our customers, we must provide the carrier with a so-called warehouse contact (the recipient's e-mail address).
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The legal basis for processing your personal data may be set out in

- Your consent (Article 6 (1 a) GDPR),
- Fulfilling or executing a contract, including pre-contractual measures (Article 6 (1 b) GDPR) and
- Fulfilling a legal obligation to which ECOMAL is subject (Article 6 (1 c) GDPR) and
- Processing data to safeguard legitimate interests (Article 6 (1 f) GDPR).

4. Safeguarding the controller's legitimate interests

If the processing of personal data is based on Article 6 (1 f) GDPR, ECOMAL's legitimate interest results from the fact that the data subject has voluntarily chosen to make their personal contact details available to ECOMAL and that ECOMAL wishes to ensure that communication between ECOMAL and the customer, supplier or service provider is channelled through this person as the central point of contact.

5. Categories of processed personal data

The following categories of your personal data are largely processed or may be processed:

- General details (name, e-mail address etc.)

6. Transfer of your personal data / transfer to a third country

For the purposes set out above, your personal data will largely be, or may be, transferred to the following recipients:

- ECOMAL departments
- ECOMAL companies
- Vishay companies
- Carrier (e-mail address of the recipient of the goods)
- Authorities (e.g. customs)

7. Storage period

We process and store your personal data for as long as is necessary for the purposes set out above (see 3.).

- Master data: we store this data for the duration of the contractual relationship and beyond (e.g. in relation to warranty claims).
- Visitor list: visitors' data is stored for a period of 8 weeks and then erased.
- Sanctions list check: we match the master data against a so-called sanctions list. The storage period for such master data is determined in accordance with the principles set out above.

- Goods dispatch: the details of the so-called warehouse contact are set out in the master data. The storage period for such master data is determined in accordance with the principles set out above.

You can contact us to view, correct or have your data deleted at any time.

8. Your rights

8.1. Rights as part of data processing

You have a right of access, right to rectification, right to erasure, right to restriction of processing, right to data portability and right to object, insofar as such cases are justified and applicable (Articles 15 – 21 GDPR).

8.2. Right to lodge a complaint with a supervisory authority

Furthermore, you have the right to lodge a complaint with a supervisory authority (Article 77 GDPR).

8.3. Right to withdraw your consent

You may withdraw your consent to the processing of personal data at any time by contacting the data controller (see 1.). Please note that the withdrawal shall only have an effect for the future.

For further information about your personal data or to exercise any of your rights under GDPR, please contact the Human Resources department or the Data Protection Officer.

8.4. Information about your right to object under Article 21 GDPR

You have the right, on grounds relating to your particular situation, to object at any time to the processing of personal data concerning you which is performed based on Article 6 (1 e) GDPR (Data processing in the public interest) and Article 6 (1 f) GDPR (Data processing based on weighing interests). This also applies to profiling within the meaning of Article 4 No. 4 GDPR based on this provision.

If you lodge an objection, we shall no longer process your personal data, unless we can demonstrate compelling legitimate grounds for the processing which override your rights, interests and freedoms, or where the processing is necessary for the establishment, exercise or defence of legal claims.

The objection is not subject to a particular form. It should be addressed to the Data Protection Officer.
