3. Purpose and legal basis of data processing

We process your personal data largely for the following purposes:

Information is stored in the cookie that relates to the specific device being used. Cookies serve various purposes. Many cookies are technically necessary for the website to function correctly. In addition, we use cookies that are not strictly necessary. These

When you visit our website, and at any time thereafter, you can choose whether you wish to allow the use of individual or all additional features in general. You can make changes in your browser settings or via our Consent Manager.
Getting in touch	When you contact us by e-mail or via a contact form, we shall store the details you provide (your e-mail address and, where applicable, your name and telephone number) so that we can answer your enquiries.
Online application	You can apply to us using the online application form on our website. If you submit an application to us, we shall process the data you have provided in it for the purpose of deciding whether to enter into an employment relationship.

The legal basis for processing your personal data may be set out in

- Your consent (Article 6 (1 a) GDPR),
- Necessity to fulfil or execute a contract, including pre-contractual measures (Article 6 (1 b) GDPR) and
- Processing data to safeguard legitimate interests (Article 6 (1 f) GDPR).

The legal basis for data processing when you visit our website (cookies) and when you contact us is Article 6 (1 a) GDPR, i.e. your voluntary consent. YouTube videos are also embedded on the basis of your consent in accordance with Article 6 (1) Letter a) GDPR, which was requested, for example, when you consented to the storage of cookies.

The legal basis for data processing when you visit our website (log files) is Article 6 (1) Sentence 1 Letter f) GDPR. Our legitimate interest is set out in the purposes of data collection listed above. Under no circumstances do we use the collected data for the purpose of drawing conclusions about your person.

The legal basis for the online application is Article 6 (1) Letter b) GDPR. Your personal data shall be disclosed within our company exclusively to those persons responsible for processing your application.

4. Safeguarding the controller's legitimate interests

Where the processing of personal data is carried out on the basis of Article 6 (1) Letter f) GDPR, ECOMAL's legitimate interest arises from the fact that the data subject has voluntarily chosen to visit ECOMAL's website and that ECOMAL wishes to ensure that, for example, the ECOMAL website is displayed in the correct screen size and in the language selected by the user in their settings.

5. Categories of processed personal data

The following categories of your personal data are largely processed or may be processed:

- General details (name etc.)
- Personnel data (employment references etc.)
- User data (e-mail address, IP address etc.)

6. Transfer of your personal data / transfer to a third country

For the purposes set out above, your personal data will largely be, or may be, transferred to the following recipients:

- ECOMAL departments (for enquiries and job applications)
- ECOMAL Works Council (for job applications)
- External software service providers (e.g. HR4You AG)

We carefully select external software service providers; they are bound by our instructions and are regularly monitored. These external software service providers include, in particular:

6.1. HEDGEHOG (Hosting of the ECOMAL website)

Our website is hosted by the external service provider HEDGEHOG. The personal data collected on the website (server log files, see 3.) is stored on the hosting provider's servers. The hosting provider shall only process your personal data in accordance with our instructions. We have entered into a data processing agreement with our service provider.

6.2. sgalinski (Consent Manager)

On our website, we use the consent technology provided by sgalinski Cookie Opt-In (Stefan Galinski Internetdienstleistungen, Bahnhofstraße Gernrode 52, D-37339 Gernrode, Germany; hereinafter "sgalinski") to obtain your consent to the storage of certain cookies in your browser or to the use of certain technologies, and to document this in accordance with data protection regulations. When you visit our website, a sgalinski cookie is stored in your browser, which records the consent you have given or any withdrawal of such consent. Such data shall not be passed on to the provider of sgalinski. The data collected shall be stored until you ask us to erase it, or until you erase the sgalinski cookie yourself, or until the purpose for which the data was stored no longer applies. The sgalinski cookie consent technology is used to obtain the legally required consent for the use of cookies. The legal basis for this is Article 6 (1) Letter c) GDPR.

6.3. Google (Integration of Google Fonts)

On this website, we use the “Google Fonts” service provided by Google Inc. This enables us to display various fonts directly on the website.

When you visit the website, Google receives information that you have accessed the relevant sub-page of our website. In addition, the data specified in Section 2 of this statement shall be transferred. This applies irrespective of whether or not Google provides a user account through which you are logged in, or you do not have a user account. If you are signed in to Google, your data shall be linked directly to your account. If you do not wish to have your profile linked to Google via the button, you must log out before clicking the button. Google stores your data in the form of usage profiles and uses it for the purposes of advertising, market research and/or tailoring its website to users’ needs. Such analysis is performed, in particular (even for users who are not logged in), to provide targeted advertising and inform other users of the social network about your activities on our website. You have the right to object to the creation of these user profiles; to exercise this right, you must contact Google.

The collected information is stored on Google’s servers, including those in the USA. Google participates in the EU-US Data Privacy Framework, which came into force on 10 July 2023, and has thereby formally committed itself to the US Department of Commerce to comply with the principles of the EU-US Data Privacy Framework. Data processing in conjunction with Google Fonts is conducted based on your consent in accordance with Article 6 (1) Letter a) GDPR, which was requested, for example, when you consented to the storage of cookies. You may withdraw your consent at any time.

6.4. OpenStreetMap (Integration of map services)

We use the OpenStreetMap mapping service on this website. This enables us to display interactive maps directly on the website and allows you to use the map function with ease.

When you visit the website, OpenStreetMap receives information indicating that you have accessed the relevant sub-page of our website. In addition, the data specified in Section 2 of this statement, as well as data relating to your interaction with the card, shall be transmitted.

The map data is accessed using the so-called Library “Leaflet.” This is a small collection of tools that enables us to use OpenStreetMap. All the necessary Leaflet “Services” are hosted locally on our own server. This means that no data is loaded from a third party provider, and no data whatsoever is passed on to third parties. Instead, the map data is streamed in real time via a wrapper function. No cookies are set, in particular, when OpenStreetMap is used in this form.

Data is processed in conjunction with OpenStreetMap based on your consent in accordance with Article 6 (1) Letter a) GDPR, which was sought, for example, when you consented to the storage of cookies. You may withdraw your consent at any time.

6.5. YouTube (embedding YouTube videos)

We have embedded YouTube videos in our online content; these are stored at <http://www.YouTube.com> and can be played directly from our website. These are all integrated in “Enhanced privacy mode,” i.e. no data is transferred to YouTube about you as a user if you do not play the videos. The data listed below shall only be transmitted once you start playing the videos. We have no control over such data transfer.

When you visit the website, YouTube receives information that you have accessed the relevant sub-page of our website. In addition, the data referred to in sub-section 3 of this statement shall be transferred. This happens regardless of whether or not YouTube provides a user account through which you are logged in, or if no user account exists. If you are signed in to Google, your data shall be linked directly to your account. If you do not wish to link this to your YouTube profile, you must log out before clicking the button. YouTube stores your data as usage profiles and uses them for the purposes of advertising, market research and/or tailoring its website to your needs. Such analysis is performed, in particular (even for users who are not logged in), to provide targeted advertising and inform other users of the social network about your activities on our website. You have the right to object to the creation of these user profiles, and to exercise this right you must contact YouTube.

The collected information is stored on Google’s servers, including those in the USA. Google participates in the EU-US Data Privacy Framework, which came into force on 10 July 2023, and has thereby formally committed itself to the US Department of Commerce to comply with the principles of the EU-US Data Privacy Framework. 6.6. Facebook (Pixel and conversion tracking)

Our website uses advertising services provided by Facebook Inc. (“Facebook”). By integrating the so-called “Facebook Pixel” into our website, we are able to display our advertising measures (“Facebook Ads”) to users of our website and the Facebook social network, and

measure and evaluate their effectiveness (“Conversion tracking”). This link between Facebook and our website is technically facilitated by the “Facebook Pixel.” The legal basis for the processing of your data is Article 6 (1), Sentence 1, Letter a) GDPR, i.e. your data shall only be processed with your consent.

Due to the marketing tools used, your browser automatically establishes a direct connection to Facebook’s server when you visit our website. We have no control over the scope and further use of the data collected by Facebook through the use of this tool and, therefore, outline the processes known to us as follows: By way of the integration of the Facebook Pixel, Facebook receives information that you have visited the relevant page on our website or clicked on an advert from us. If you are registered with a Facebook service, Facebook may associate your visit with your account. Even if you are not registered on Facebook or have not logged in, there is a possibility that the provider may obtain your IP address and other identifying details and use them to build a profile.

“The collected information is stored on servers belonging to Meta (formerly Facebook), including in the US.” Meta is a participant in the EU-US Data Privacy Framework, which came into force on 10 July 2023, and has thereby formally committed itself to the US Department of Commerce to comply with the principles of the EU-US Data Privacy Framework. Meta’s EU-US Data Privacy Framework registration can be found at <https://www.dataprivacyframework.gov/s/participant-search/participant-detail?id=a2zt0000000GnywAAC&status=Active> can be viewed here. In accordance with the European Commission’s adequacy decision of 10 July 2023, the EU-US Data Privacy Framework guarantees an adequate level of data protection, i.e. one that is substantively equivalent to that of the EU. In addition, we have agreed so-called Standard Contractual Clauses with Meta, the purpose of which is to ensure an adequate level of data protection in the third country.

You may withdraw your consent at any time, without this affecting the lawfulness of the processing conducted prior to the withdrawal. 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6.7. Matomo (web analytics)

On this website, we use the web analytics service Matomo to analyse and monitor the use of our website. The statistics we collect enable us to improve our service and make it more appealing to you as a user.

We run Matomo using a version that does not require cookies. Therefore, no Matomo cookies are stored on your computer for the purpose of web analytics. To analyse website usage, your IP address and information such as timestamps, the web pages you have visited and your language settings are collected. We store the information collected in this way on our server.

This website uses Matomo with the “AnonymizeIP” extension. As a result, IP addresses are truncated during processing, thereby ruling out any direct association with specific individuals. The IP address transmitted from your browser via Matomo is not combined with any other data we collect. The legal basis for the use of Matomo is Article 6 (1), Sentence 1, Letter f) GDPR.

You can prevent Matomo from being used by unchecking the following box to activate the opt-out plug-in: <https://www.ecomal.com/matomo-opt-out/>. In this case, an opt-out cookie shall be stored in your browser, which prevents Matomo from storing usage data. If you erase your cookies, this will result in the Matomo opt-out cookie also being erased. The opt-out must be reactivated the next time you visit our site. This means that you will need to opt out again the next time you visit our website.

The Matomo programme is an open-source project. You can find the third party provider’s information on data protection at <https://matomo.org/privacy-policy/>.

6.8. HR4YOU (online application)

To ensure a smooth application process (display of job vacancies, application portal, receipt, processing and management of application documents), we use tools provided by HR4YOU AG, Ulbarger Straße 52, D-26629 Großefehn / Timmel, Germany, on our website. In that respect, we process the data you provide during the application process (such as your name, address, date of birth, CV, contact details, application photo and cover letter – depending on the specific application and the requirements of the relevant job advertisement), as well as the data necessary for the online application portal to function (including the correct display of website content) (such as your IP address). HR4YOU acts as our data processor within the meaning of Article 4 No. 8 GDPR; i.e. it processes personal data on our behalf, meaning that we remain the data controller within the meaning of GDPR for the data processing. Accordingly, we have entered into a data processing agreement (DPA) with HR4YOU to ensure an adequate level of data protection. Your data shall only be processed for the purposes set out above.

The legal basis for processing your data is Article 6 (1), Sentence 1, Letter a) GDPR, i.e. your consent; Article 6 (1), Letter b) GDPR; and our legitimate interest in an organised recruitment process in accordance with Article 6 (1), Sentence, Letter f) GDPR.

If we are unable to offer you a position, if you withdraw your application, if you decline our job offer, or if you request that we erase your data, your application documents shall be stored at most for 6 months after the application process ends.

Once the storage period has expired, the data shall be erased unless a statutory storage obligation applies or any other legal basis for further storage. This does not affect any other statutory storage obligations. Provided that you have granted your consent in accordance with Article 6 (1) Letter a) GDPR to the continued storage of your application data to be informed of suitable job vacancies in future, we shall store your data until you withdraw your consent.

Consent may be withdrawn at any time.

6.9. Famigo (location marketing tool)

On this website, we use the services of Famigo GmbH (In der Spöck 10, D-77656 Offenburg) to showcase the advantages of our location and provide up-to-date information about infrastructure, leisure activities and relevant business opportunities. We have integrated a

location marketing tool (“locationexplorer.de”) from Famigo into our website via iFrames, which enables the display and provision of graphics and content from Famigo on our website. For these purposes, Famigo collects the following data: browser type, browser version, referrer URL, used operating system, time and date of the server request and hostname of the accessing computer.

The collected data collected is stored for 90 days. It is not used for any other purposes. The database and the cloud solution are hosted in data centres in Germany. A data processing agreement has been entered into with Famigo. The legal basis for using Famigo’s location marketing tool is our legitimate interest, within the meaning of Article 6 (1) Letter f) GDPR, in presenting the advantages of our location in an appealing and up-to-date manner on our website.

6.10. LinkedIn, Xing, Facebook, Instagram (redirection to social media platforms)

We have various websites on so-called social media platforms. At the bottom of the page, there are four clickable social media icons that link to ECOMAL’s corporate websites on these social media channels:

The links are merely passive links – and, therefore, not so-called social media plug-ins. By simply placing these passive links, therefore, no personal data is collected by the operators of the social media platforms or transferred to them.

Data can only be processed in this manner when the data subject clicks on the link, and is, therefore, redirected to the corresponding external page, i.e. the respective social media profile.

We have no control over the content or data processing on these websites. Please refer to the privacy policy on the relevant website for information on the purpose and scope of data collection, as well as the further processing and use of the data and your rights in this regard and the options available to you for protecting your privacy.

We make use of the providers' technical platform and services for these information services. Please note that you use our social media platforms and their features at your own risk. This applies, in particular, to the use of interactive features (e.g. commenting, sharing, rating). When you visit our social media pages, the social media platform providers collect, among other things, your IP address and other information stored on your device in the form of cookies. This information is used to provide us, as the account operators, with statistical data on interactions with us.

The data processed in this context relating to you is processed by the platforms and may, in some cases, be transferred to countries outside the European Union, in particular the USA. The information collected is stored on the providers' servers, including those outside Europe. In such cases, the provider has opted to comply with the EU-U. S. Privacy Framework. If the provider is not certified, we have agreed on so-called standard data protection clauses, the purpose of which is to ensure an adequate level of data protection in the third country. We are not aware of how social media platforms use the data generated by your visits to our account and your interactions with our posts for their own purposes, how long such data is stored or whether or not it is passed on to third parties. Data processing may vary depending on whether or not you are registered with and logged in to the social network, or whether or not you are visiting the site as an unregistered and/or logged-out user.

When you access a post or your account, the IP address assigned to your device is transmitted to the social media platform provider. If you are currently logged in as a user, a cookie on your device can be used to track your browsing activity on the website. Buttons embedded in websites enable the platforms to track your visits to these websites and link them to your respective profile. Such data can be used to tailor content or advertising to your interests. If you wish to prevent this, you should log out or disable the “Stay logged in” function, erase the cookies stored on your device and restart your browser.

Furthermore, as the provider of this information service, we only process data relating to your use of our service that you make available to us and which requires interaction. For example, if you ask a question that we can only answer by e-mail, we shall store your information in accordance with our general data processing principles, as set out in this privacy policy. The legal basis for processing your data on the social media platform is Article 6 (1) Sentence 1 Letter f GDPR.

To exercise your rights as a data subject, you may contact either us or the provider of the social media platform. If a party is not responsible for responding to your enquiry or needs to obtain the information from the other party, we or the provider shall forward your enquiry to the relevant partner. If you have any questions regarding profiling or the processing of your data when using the website, please contact the operator of the social media platform directly. If you have any questions regarding the processing of your interactions with us on our website, please contact us using the contact details provided above.

The providers describe in their privacy policies (see the link in the table above) what information the social media platform receives and how it is used. There you will also find information about how to get in touch and on advertising options. You can also find further information on social media and how to protect your data at www.youngdata.de.

7. Storage period

We process and store your personal data for as long as is necessary for the purposes set out above (see 3.).

- **Website visit**

Server log files are stored for a period of 7 days and are then automatically erased.

The ECOMAL website uses the following types of cookies:

- Session cookies are automatically erased when you close your browser or log out. They contain what is known as a session ID, which allows various requests from your browser to be linked to the same session.
- Temporary cookies are automatically erased after a specified period, which varies depending on the cookie.

Examples of temporary cookies include, for example,

- `cookie_optin`: this cookie is used to store your cookie settings for this website. The data storage period is 1 year.

- _fbp: this cookie is used by Meta (Facebook) to display a range of advertising products, such as real-time bids from third party advertisers. The storage period is 3 months.
- OGPC; 1 day; set by YouTube and/or Google as soon as a video is embedded on a page and/or played. For further information about the type, use and purpose of cookies, please click on the following link: <http://www.google.com/intl/de/policies/privacy/>

You can view the cookies that have been set and their expiry dates at any time in your browser settings, and erase the cookies manually.

- **Getting in touch**

We shall erase the data you have made available in this context (your e-mail address, and, where applicable, your name and telephone number), once storage is no longer necessary, or we shall restrict the processing where statutory storage obligations apply.

- **Online application**

If we are unable to offer you a position, if you withdraw your application, if you decline our job offer, or if you request that we erase your data, your application documents shall be stored at most for 6 months after the application process ends.

Once the storage period has expired, the data shall be erased, provided no statutory storage obligation applies or any other legal basis for its continued storage.

If you have granted your consent in accordance with Article 6 (1) Letter a) GDPR to the continued storage of your applicant data to be informed of suitable job vacancies in future, we shall store your data until such consent is withdrawn. You may withdraw your consent at any time.

8. Your rights

8.1. Rights as part of data processing

You have a right of access, right to rectification, right to erasure, right to restriction of processing, right to data portability and right to object, insofar as such cases are justified and applicable (Articles 15 – 21 GDPR).

8.2. Right to lodge a complaint with a supervisory authority

Furthermore, you have the right to lodge a complaint with a supervisory authority (Article 77 GDPR).

8.3. Right to withdraw your consent

You may withdraw your consent to the processing of personal data at any time by contacting the data controller (see 1.). Please note that the withdrawal shall only have an effect for the future.

For further information about your personal data or to exercise any of your rights under GDPR, please contact the Data Protection Officer.

8.4. Information about your right to object under Article 21 GDPR

You have the right, on grounds relating to your particular situation, to object at any time to the processing of personal data concerning you which is performed based on Article 6 (1 e) GDPR (Data processing in the public interest) and Article 6 (1 f) GDPR (Data processing based on weighing interests). This also applies to profiling within the meaning of Article 4 No. 4 GDPR based on this provision.

If you lodge an objection, we shall no longer process your personal data, unless we can demonstrate compelling legitimate grounds for the processing which override your rights, interests and freedoms, or where the processing is necessary for the establishment, exercise or defence of legal claims.

The objection is not subject to a particular form. It should be addressed to the Data Protection Officer.
